The Cherokee County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Friday, September 12, 2008 with Dean Schmidt, Mark Leeds, Terry Graybill, Jeff Simonsen, and Ron Wetherell in attendance. Mike Leckband, *Chronicle Times*, was also present.

MSP Wetherell, Schmidt to approve the agenda and minutes of the previous meeting.

Jody Hauptert, Auditor's Assistant, reviewed the 2008 School Election results.

MSP Wetherell, Graybill to authorize chairman to sign a request of change of address on the FY09 Local Public Health Services (LPHS) contract so that all warrants issued by the State of Iowa will be mailed to the Board of Supervisors.

Dave Shanahan, County Engineer, presented two utility permits for consideration.

MSP Graybill, Schmidt to approve an underground permit for High Tech Electric (Qwest) in Section 28 of Spring Twp and an underground natural gas line for Kenny & Rhonda Barrett in Section 9 of Liberty Twp.

Shanahan discussed long term road construction plans and increasing costs of road maintenance.

MSP Schmidt, Graybill to approve claims for payment as presented. A complete listing is available in the Auditor's Office.

2008 Jail Inspection report was reviewed. Dept of Corrections gave a favorable report, stating "The jail staff is doing a good job in a facility that was not designed for current needs."

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:05 a.m.
